ENGINEERING/ TECHNOLOGY IN THE AUTONOMOUS INSTITUTES (COEP,
PUNE, VJTI, MUMBAI; SGGSIET, NANDED, and WCE, SANGLI) FOR THE
ACADEMIC YEAR 2011– 2012

1.0 Introduction

The entrance examination for the selection to all **Health Science Degree Courses, Engineering and Pharmacy degree courses** in State of Maharashtra for the academic year 2011-2012 was conducted by the Competent Authority appointed by Government of Maharashtra on **Thursday, 12th May 2011**, at all the district headquarters in the State of Maharashtra. Separate **Admission Process by Allotment for autonomous institutes for 100% state level seats** will be conducted on the basis of **MHT-CET 2011** score, by Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai.

The admissions of the Autonomous Institutes [**viz. i) Veermata Jijabai Technological Institute (VJTI), Mumbai, ii) College of Engineering, Pune, (COEP), iii) Shri Guru Gobind Singhji Institute of Engineering & Technology (SGGSIET), Nanded, and iv) Walchand College of Engineering, Sangli**] is being separately carried out by Directorate of Technical Education from this academic year. **The admissions of Deemed University i.e Institute of Chemical Technology (ICT), Mumbai is being separately carried out by the institute. There will be a separate Information Brochure specifying the rules of admission to ICT Mumbai.**

This brochure gives the rules and information regarding the eligibility for admission to first year of four year degree courses in Engineering/Technology in Autonomous institutes in the State of Maharashtra and also gives definition of various types of candidatures. These rules govern the aspects of the Centralised Admission Process for autonomous institutes and it also gives the rules and information regarding the type of seats under various; details of the Reservation of seats, Fees concession offered to eligible candidates, details of the Centralized Admission Process of autonomous institutes (CAPAI), details of the Admission rounds, Institute/course wise Information, etc.

Admitted candidates under this admission process are not eligible to participate in the Centralized Allotment Process to be conducted for other Engineering colleges by Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai for the academic year 2011-12.

1.2 Definitions:

1. **'Application Form'** means prescribed form filled up by the candidate online for admission
2. **'Autonomous Institute'** means the institute for which autonomy has been granted by the Govt. of Maharashtra
3. **'Candidate'** means an applicant who has appeared for **MHT-CET 2011** and who has submitted **Application Form** in the prescribed format to seek admission to first year of the four year Degree Course in Engineering/ Technology in these Autonomous Institutes of Maharashtra State for the year 2011- 12.
4. **"Competent Authority"** means the Authority headed by the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, shall be the authority for Centralised Admission Process for autonomous institutes and direct the students as per their allotment through CAPAI to all colleges.
5. **'State Government'** means the Government of Maharashtra.
6. **'Director'** means the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State.
7. **'Director COEP'** means the Director of College of Engineering, Shivajinagar, Pune
8. **'Director VJTI'** means the Director of Veermata Jijabai Technological Institute, Matunga, Mumbai
9. **'Director SGGSIET'** means the Director of Shri Guru Gobind Singhji Institute of Engineering and Technology, Nanded
10. **'Director, WCE '** means the Director of Walchand College of Engineering, Sangli
11. **'Representative of the Competent Authority'** means an officer appointed to assist Competent Authority for smooth conduct of Admission Process as per the directives of the Competent Authority.
12. **"Qualifying examination"** means examination on the result of which a candidate becomes eligible for admission i.e. HSC(12th standard) or equivalent examination
13. **'College' or 'Institution'** means Engineering College or Technological Institution duly approved by the AICTE and Government of Maharashtra to impart Education in Engineering/ Technology at the degree level.
14. **'Sanctioned Intake'** means the course wise number of seats sanctioned by the Government Resolution with reference to the AICTE's approval.
15. **'Inter se merit'** means the order of merit as defined by Maharashtra State Merit list/Home University area merit list/All India (AIEEE) Merit list/J & K Migrant Merit list as the case may be.
16. **'Candidate'** means an applicant who is an Indian National and desires to seek admission to first year of four year Degree Courses in Engineering/Technology in Maharashtra State by submitting the prescribed application form online for the year 2011-2012.
17. **"Defence"** means services established under the Army Act 1950/Airforce Act 1950/Navy Act 1957.

18. **'F.E. Admission'** means the Admission to first year of four year degree courses in Engineering / Technology.
19. **"Persons of Indian Origin (PIO)"**: A Person having foreign citizenship (except Pakistan and Bangladesh) without "NRI" status, who holds a Foreign Passport at the time of sending application, consideration for admission and during the period of his/her study, and he/she or any one/both of his/her parents or any one/both of his/her grand parents is (or was)/are (or were) citizen(s) of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of India or Sec. 2(b) of Citizenship Act, 1955 (Act No. 57 of 1955).
20. **'OMS candidate'** means Outside Maharashtra State candidate who is an Indian National.
21. **'Foreign Nationals'** means Citizens of all countries other than India, who are not of Indian origin as defined under PIO.
22. **'Foreign Student'** means Foreign Student in this context shall be defined as the student who possesses a foreign passport.
23. **'CAP Seats'** These are the seats for which allotment/admission is carried out by the Competent Authority through CAP
24. **'NRI'**: Non Resident Indian as per the definition given in the section 6 of the Income Tax Act 1961.
25. **'NRI Candidate'** means a candidate who is a child/ward of the person who has the 'NRI status' as defined under section 6 of the Income Tax Act.

1.3 Role of Competent Authority in the process of First Year Engineering/Technology Admission:

- a) The Competent Authority for the admissions of these Autonomous Institutes of Maharashtra State will be the **Director, Technical Education, Maharashtra State**. The Competent Authority shall be the authority to invite applications, process them, declare schedule of admission process, and direct the students as per their allotment through **CAPCAI** to the Autonomous Institutes of Maharashtra State.
- b) Competent Authority shall be the sole authority to effect admission through **CAPCAI** for these Autonomous Institutes of Maharashtra State.
- c) The Competent Authority shall also deal with the representations received from the candidates pertaining to allotment and admissions in these Autonomous Institutes of Maharashtra State and act as Grievance Redressal Authority and Appellate Authority at State level.
- d) All the decisions taken in relation to First Year Admission by the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all concerned.

1.4 Seats available for admission through Competent Authority

The 100% state level seats for which allotment is carried out by the Competent Authority through CAPCAI will be available for the admission. The Institute wise & course wise details of seats available through CAPAI are given in annexure-V.

1.5 Additional Seats available for admission through CAPCAI under the seats available against Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme as mentioned in Approval Process Handbook published by AICTE in Chapter II –

The salient features of the scheme are as follows:-

- The Competent Authority for admissions shall be the same as for regular admissions.
- This scheme shall be applicable and mandatory to all institutes under CAPAI.
- Under this Scheme, up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available for these admissions. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature.
- Sons and daughters of parents whose annual income is less than Rs. 2.50 lakhs from all sources shall only be eligible for seats under this scheme.
- The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the Government for the Autonomous Institutions. All other Fees except tuition fees will have to be paid by the beneficiary.
- In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.
- State Admission authority shall invite applications under this category, make a separate merit list for this category and effect admissions on the basis of the merit list so generated.
- Competent Authority for admissions shall provide a separate list of the students admitted under this category to the Institute to which they are admitted for compliance.
- The Competent Authority shall display the list of beneficiary student admitted under this scheme and he / she shall not be allowed to change Institution/course under any circumstances.
- The Institutions shall also display information regarding admitted candidates in their web sites for information to the students and other stakeholders

Tuition Fee Waiver scheme shall be implemented as follows:

- The admission to these additional seats will be done along with the admission to Maharashtra State seats available for CAPCAI by the Competent Authority during allotment rounds.
- All such additional seats shall be treated as TFWS seats of Maharashtra state quota. These additional seats will be filled as State Level seats and will be made available to eligible candidates as a separate choice.
- The candidate opting for admission against these additional seats under this scheme is exempted from paying the tuition fees for the allotted course.
- Candidates willing to opt for these additional TFWS seats will have to specify their willingness in the Application form and option form as a separate choice code.
- Only Maharashtra State candidates (on the basis of score of MHT-CET-2011) will be admitted under such additional seats.
- In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants and it will remain vacant.

- The waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the Government for Autonomous institutes. All other fees except tuition fees will have to be paid by the beneficiary for the entire duration of the course.
- The Institutions should publish in their brochure and web site the number of tuition fee waivers available in each category in each course/division.
- The Competent Authority will prepare merit list of applicants from eligible students and will effect admissions strictly on inter-se-merit basis.
- The Competent Authority will display the allotment for admissions to each beneficiary.
- Students admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change Institution/course under any circumstances.
- The competent authority and Institutions will display the information regarding admitted candidates in their respective web sites for information to the students and other stakeholders.
- Institution will not charge tuition fee for the entire duration of the course to the beneficiaries irrespective of the total number of enrollment in each year of the course.
- Candidates willing to opt for these additional TFWS seats will have to submit income certificate stating that his/her parent's annual income is less than Rs. 2.50 lakhs from all sources from the appropriate competent authority of the Maharashtra State.
- These seats shall be filled only through Round-I, II and III of CAPAI process on the basis of score of MHT-CET-2011.

1.6 Seats available with other authorities:

1.6.1 Additional seats available with the authority

The following additional seats are available with the institution authority as mentioned in table below. Candidates are requested to approach the concerned authority directly for admission against these seats.

- The admission on additional seats will be carried out by the respective institute.
- Candidates aspiring to seek admission on these seats are required to appear for the MHT-CET-2011.

- Candidates admitted to these seats are required to fulfill minimum eligibility criteria as given in this information brochure for admission in autonomous engineering colleges in Maharashtra.
- Course wise distribution for these seats will be carried out by the concerned admission authority.
- The concerned admission authority shall communicate the course wise seat distribution to the competent authority before start of CAPAI.

2.0 Eligibility Criteria:

2.1 Eligibility criteria for Maharashtra State Candidate:

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the HSC (Std.XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination with subjects English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics **AND** Secured minimum **50% marks** i.e. not less than 150 marks out of 300 marks (minimum **45% marks** i.e. not less than 135 marks out of 300 marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories belonging only to Maharashtra State) in **the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics** added together **AND** must have secured **minimum 55% marks** i.e. 110 marks out of 200 marks (**minimum 50% marks** i.e. 100 marks out of 200 marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra state only) in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at the **MHT-CET 2011**

2.2 Eligibility Criteria and availability of seats for Admission to Foreign National/ Foreign student/ PIO/ Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries

A. Availability of seats-

Fifteen percent (15 %) seats in the institution shall be allowed on supernumerary basis from amongst Foreign Nationals / Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) / Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries, over and above the approved intake, provided that 1/3rd of the 15 % shall be reserved across different disciplines in the educational institution, for the Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries. However, any vacant seats out of 1/3rd category shall be reverted to the quota of 2/3rd meant for PIO / Foreign Nationals. **Availability of these seats is subjected to the approval of AICTE.**

B. Eligibility Criteria-

Candidate should have passed the HSC (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent with Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics and having either studied English as one of the subjects or as a medium of the instruction. The candidates should have secured **minimum 50% marks** in the Subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

- The eligibility of the candidates passing the HSC (Std. XII) or equivalent examination from a school/ college/ Examination Board situated outside India shall be further decided by the University Authorities to which the candidate is admitted. Hence such candidates are advised to get their eligibility verified by the respective University Authorities before seeking admission to the Engineering courses in the State of Maharashtra.

- The candidate belonging to this type is not required to appear for the MHT-CET 2011.
- **Candidates once admitted under this category, will continue to be governed by the rules in force for this category only**
- **No refund of fees is applicable.**
- **Candidates taking admission under this quota shall not be eligible for CAPAI .**

2.3 Admissions of Foreign Nationals / Foreign Students / Persons of Indian Origin /Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries and fees applicable to them

Aspiring candidates, fulfilling the eligibility criteria, for Foreign Nationals/ Foreign students/ PIOs/ Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries and having educational qualification as mentioned in these rules shall directly submit their applications to **The Director, College of Engineering, Pune** along with application processing fees of **Rs. 15000/-**. Tuition fees in Govt. / Govt. aided institutions for these students will be **\$3500 and the Development fees will be \$1500**. The Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries shall be treated at par with resident citizens for the purpose of application of fee.

Students admitted under this category shall be given allotment of Hostel accommodation on priority. Details of admission process are available on the websites: www.coep.org.in

2.4 Eligibility criteria for Candidates who are sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

In addition to the basic eligibility criterion mentioned in rule no.2.1, and satisfying any one of the following criteria as are eligible to seek admission against seats for sons/daughters of defence service personnel.

- Candidate is a son/daughter of ex-service personnel who is domiciled in Maharashtra State (Def-1).
- Candidate is a son/daughter of active service personnel who is domiciled in Maharashtra State (Def-2).
- Candidate is a son/daughter of active service personnel (Def -3)
 - Who is transferred to Maharashtra State but is not domiciled in Maharashtra State
 - Who is not domiciled in Maharashtra State but his/her family is stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on the grounds of childrens' education, provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC (Std.XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

Note:

This provision is NOT available to the children of CIVILIAN STAFF who is working/ who has worked with the Indian Defence Services.

2.5 Eligibility criteria for Candidates who are Physically Handicapped:

In addition to the basic qualification mentioned in rule no. 2.1, and suffering from any one of the following permanent disability is eligible to seek admission against seats for Physically Handicapped candidates

- Candidate who is visually impaired (blind) candidate (type P1)
- Candidate who is speech & hearing impaired (deaf & dumb) candidate (type P2)
- Candidate who is with orthopedic disorders, learning disabilities, Dyslexia, Dyscalculia, Dysgraphica, Spastic (type P3)

Note:

The certificate (Proforma F/F-1) should clearly state that the extent of disability is more than 40% and the disability is permanent in nature.

2.6 Eligibility criteria for MKB candidates:

In addition to the basic eligibility criterion mentioned in rule no. 2.1, and candidates belonging to the Maharashtra Karnataka Disputed Border Area are required to fulfil following additional eligibility criterions.

- Candidates should be from such villages/towns, from the Maharashtra Karnataka disputed border areas, on which Maharashtra puts its claim.
- The candidate should produce the certificate that his/her father/mother/candidate himself/herself is a domicile of Karnataka in the disputed border area as specified in the Proforma G1/G2 **OR** The candidate should produce the domicile certificate of his/her father/mother/candidate himself/herself stating that he/she is a resident of a village.
- The candidate should have passed SSC (or equivalent) and/or HSC (or equivalent) from an Institution situate in the disputed border area. The candidate must produce a certificate from the Principal/Head Master of the College/School stating that the candidate has passed SSC/HSC (or equivalent) Examination from that Institution.
- Mother tongue of the candidate must be Marathi. The candidate must produce a certificate from the Principal/Head Master of the School from which he/she has passed the SSC (or equivalent) Examination, stating that the candidate's Mother tongue is Marathi as per the original School record.
- Candidate should have passed SSC or HSC (or equivalent) Examination with Marathi as one of the subject.

2.7 Other eligibility criteria for specialized branches of Engineering/Technology:

Candidates seeking admission to some special courses or under some special provisions have to fulfill the following additional eligibility criteria.

- **Admission to Bio- Medical/Bio-tech Engineering course :**

Candidates seeking admission to Biomedical Engineering course should have passed in the subject of Biology in the qualifying examination in addition to fulfilling the Eligibility criteria as mentioned in rule no. 2.1.

Candidates seeking admission to Bio-Technology Engineering course should have passed in the subject of Biology/Bio-Tehncology in the qualifying examination in addition to fulfilling the Eligibility criteria as mentioned in rule no. 2.1.

General Notes:

1. In case the maximum marks in individual subject is other than 100, convert the marks out of 100 for individual subject but do not *round off* these marks. If the sum of the converted marks of three individual subjects without rounding off works out to be a figure with fraction then fraction up to two decimal places will only be considered
Example: If a candidate obtains 101 marks out of 200 in Physics, 86 marks out of 150 in Chemistry and 40 Marks out of 100 in Mathematics, then the sum of marks obtained works out to be 227 out of 450 marks. If it is converted out of 300, it works out to be 151.33. However if the marks in individual subjecte are converted out of 100, then the marks are as 50.5 in Physics, 57.3333 in Chemistry and 40 in Mathematics. It means the sum of converted marks of individual subject is 147.8333, which is 147.83 upto two fraction. Hence the candidate is not eligible for admission under OPEN Category.
2. If **letter grades** are assigned instead of marks at SSC, HSC or its equivalent examination the candidate must obtain the certificate of conversion of letter of grades into marks from the competent authority where from the candidate has passed the examination. The candidate should produce such certificate at the time of submission of application form. The Eligibility shall be decided based on the equivalent marks submitted by such candidates.
3. If the candidate reappears for the qualifying examination (Std. XII or its equivalent) **with all subjects** then the marks obtained in the latest examination will only be considered for determining the eligibility criterion.

3.0 Types of Maharashtra State Candidates:

A candidate is considered eligible for admission to the seats of Maharashtra State coming under the purview of competent authority subject to fulfillment of any one of the eligibility requirements as listed in the following table.

Note: Type-A candidates should produce the Leaving or Bonafied Certificate issued by the Institute where the candidate passed/appeared the HSC (Std. XII). These candidates should also produce the Domicile Certificate of Candidate at the time of submission of "Application form for Admission through CAP".		
2.	Type-B (Maharashtra Domiciled candidates)	Does not satisfy as Type - A Candidate and Candidate/Father or Mother of the candidate is Domiciled in the State of Maharashtra
Note: Type-B candidates should produce the Domicile Certificate of Candidate/Father or Mother of the candidate at the time of submission of "Application form for Admission through CAP".		
3	Type – C (Sons and daughters of central Govt. / Govt. of India Undertaking employee)	Does not satisfy as Type -A and Type-B Candidate but Father/Mother of the candidate is an employee of the Government of India or Government of India Undertaking who is posted and reported to duty in Maharashtra State before the last date for submitting the Application Form for Centralized Admission.
Note: Type-C Candidates should produce Certificate in the proforma "A" regarding the employment status of Father/ Mother at the time of submission of "Application form for Admission through CAP".

Note:

- Candidate can claim ONLY one type of candidature while submitting the application form. The Indian National candidates who are not of Type-A, Type-B, Type-C or Type-D will be the Outside Maharashtra State Candidate (OMS) and such OMS candidates are not eligible for this CAPAI.
- For claiming facility under Type A, B, C, D & E, it is binding for the candidates to produce the documentary proof along with the application form for CAP to claim the facility.
- The candidate should submit the applicable certificate in the necessary Proforma at the time of filling up of Application Form for CAP.

4.0 Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

4.1 Reservation for Backward Class category Candidates:

The percentage of seats reserved for candidates of backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra State is as per the details in table given below. The percentages of reservation are the percentages of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates, which are coming under the purview of the Competent Authority. These are the minimum percentages of reservation exclusive of the backward class candidates securing allotment through General Merit by virtue of merit. Backward class candidates shall claim the category to which they belong to at the time of submission of application form for Centralized Admission Process .

Note:

1. The reservation for backward class candidates shall be available in Autonomous colleges and it will be 50% of Maharashtra State CAPAI seats.
2. Candidates belonging to **Special Backward Class (SBC)** will be offered reservation up to 2% seats of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates which are coming under the purview of the Competent Authority subject to condition that any seats remain vacant in the reserved category at the end of stage-I of allotment. These seats are carved out during the allotment stage-I and no separate seats are earmarked before the start of the allotment process. SBC Candidates having original category OBC will be considered at par with OBC Candidates.
3. Even if the candidate belonging to Backward Class Category secures admission against a seat belonging to the General category by virtue of merit, such candidate has to produce all the necessary documents in support of the category claimed both at the time of admission and while filling up of the Centralised Admission Process admission form.
4. Backward Class Category recognised by Maharashtra State are only eligible to claim reservation for Backward class category.

4.2 Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five (5) % seats of the total sanctioned intake for an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAPAI shall be reserved for

- Children of ex- service personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1).
- Children of active service personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2).
- Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) –
 - Who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State,
 - Who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC (Std.XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination from a school/college situate in the State of Maharashtra.

These seats are within the sanctioned intake capacity. A combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 & DEF3 candidates shall be prepared. Admission against the Defence category seats will be made strictly on the basis of inter-se-merit combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 & DEF3 candidates.

Refer Pro forma C, D and E for claiming this provision.

Note:-

This provision is NOT available to the children of **CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working / who has worked in the Indian Defence Service.

4.3 Reservation for Physically Handicapped Candidates:

As per the provisions in Clause 39 of Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation Act 1995, three percent (3%) seats of total sanctioned intake capacity of all the institutions coming under CAPAI shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates.

- visually impaired (blind) candidates (P1)
- speech & hearing impaired (deaf & dumb) candidates, (P2)
- Orthopedic disorders, learning disabilities, Dyslexia, Dyscalculia, Dysgraphica, Spastic (P3)

Allotment of the seats reserved for the Physically Handicapped candidates shall be done on the basis of an inter-se merit of respective type of handicap of such candidates..

Note:-

It should be noted that the physically handicapped candidates on admission to Engineering / Technology degree course will not be given any exemptions or additional facilities in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the respective Institutes/Universities. Further it is specifically brought to the notice of Physically Handicapped candidates that, they should submit the certificates strictly as per the Proforma- F/F-1.

4.4 Reservation for Female candidates:

As per the provisions in Govt. Resolution No. GEC-1000/ (123/2000)/ Tech. Edu.-1, dated 17th April, 2000, 30% seats available for Maharashtra State CAPAI shall be reserved for female candidates in all the courses of the institutions coming under CAPAI. This reservation shall be applicable for General, SC, ST, DT/VJ (NT-A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D and OBC categories. There shall be no reservation for Female candidates under Defence, Physically Handicapped and SBC categories.

4.5 Reservation of seats for the candidates belonging to the Maharashtra-Karnataka Border (disputed area) MS Type-E candidates:

These candidates will be considered eligible for admission for the seats of Maharashtra State of CAPAI. These candidates will also be eligible for vacant seats to be filled through additional round at respective Institutes.

IMPORTANT: All such candidates who fail to substantiate claims made (such as reservation category, PH, Defence etc.) with supporting necessary documents shall be converted to GENERAL category and/or such applications will be rejected as the case may be. Once such candidates are converted to GENERAL category and they will have to fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria as set out for a GENERAL category candidate.

5.0 Assignment of Merit Number:

5.1 Merit Number for Maharashtra Candidates:

- Each eligible Maharashtra State Candidate (Rule 2.1) who has submitted application form on or before the last date prescribed for the submission of Application Form for Admission to Engineering through CAPAI will be assigned a provisional merit number.
- Merit of all eligible Maharashtra State candidates will be based on the MHT-CET 2011 score (out of 200 marks) only; relative merit in case of a tie (i.e. equal marks in MHT-CET 2011) shall be resolved as per rule no. 5.1.1.

Note:

1. **Merit list of Maharashtra State Candidates so prepared shall indicate a State level General Merit No., State level Category Merit no. (as applicable) etc.**
2. **Assignment of a Merit number does not indicate or ensure admission to any seat.**

Relative Merit in Case of a Tie:

In the case of candidates securing equal number of marks in MHT-CET-2011, their relative merit will be fixed on the basis of the following order of preference:

- (a) A candidate securing higher marks out of 100 in the subject of Mathematics in MHT-CET-2011.
- (b) A candidate securing higher marks out of 50 in the subject of Physics in MHT-CET-2011.
- (c) A candidate passing the SSC (Std. X) examination with higher aggregate marks.
- (d) A candidate securing higher marks in the subject of Mathematics at SSC (Std. X) Examination.
- (e) Birth Date of the candidate (Elder Candidate will be given preference)

Note: While converting the marks, if the converted marks work out to be a figure with fraction, fraction up to two decimal places will only be considered.

5.2 Merit Number for Foreign Nationals / Foreign Students / Persons of Indian Origin /Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries Candidates:

Assignment of merit number:

- Each eligible Candidate who has filled application form for Admission on or before the last date will be assigned a provisional merit number. Merit of all eligible candidates will be based on the total marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics in HSC (Std. XII) only; relative merit in case of a tie (i.e. equal marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics taken together out of 300) shall be resolved in the order of preference as given below:

- a. A candidate securing higher % marks in Mathematics of HSC.
- b. A candidate securing higher % marks in Physics of HSC.
- c. A candidate securing higher % marks in SSC (Std. X) examination
- d. A candidate securing higher % marks in Mathematics at SSC (Std. X) Examination.
- e. Birth Date of the candidate (Elder Candidate will be given preference)

Note:

- **While converting the marks, if the converted marks work out to be a figure with fraction, fraction up to two decimal places will only be considered.**
- Assignment of a Merit number does not indicate or ensure admission to any seat.
- These admissions will be made strictly as per merit on or before the commencement of academic session for the first semester/year for the current academic year.
- The admission against these supernumerary seats is permitted to the institutes only after the institute gets an approval from AICTE.
- If any seats available for Foreign Nationals / Foreign Students / Persons of Indian Origin / Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries remain vacant due to non-availability of eligible candidates for these seats, such vacant seats shall be kept vacant. **Under any condition these seats shall not be offered to any other candidates.**

5.3 Change of Marks due to verification:

If the marks in the qualifying examination are modified due to verification and the same is duly certified by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent, the same shall be reported to the ARC incharge immediately.

However the effect of the change will be taken into consideration only for the subsequent round(s) of admission.

6.0 Rules of Admission through Centralized Admission Process for Autonomous Institutes (CAPAI) :

This section briefly explains the various stages and procedure adopted for the CAPAI. Candidates seeking admission to Engineering/Technology courses are required to appear for MHT-CET 2011 conducted by the Competent Authority of Govt. of Maharashtra.

For the academic year 2011-2012, the Competent Authority shall conduct total Four (4) rounds of Centralized Admission. The CAPAI shall consist of first three (3) rounds of Centralized Allotment wherein eligible candidates of respective rounds will fill & confirm fresh Online Option forms for respective rounds. The Maharashtra Candidate eligible for Autonomous Institutes is required to submit only single Application form for both CAP and CAPAIs. Fourth round of CAPAI shall be conducted by way of counseling at institute level, only for the eligible candidates as per the rules of reporting.

Major Steps for the admission through CAPAI are summarized below:

1. Issue of Information Brochure at ARCs
2. **Filling up** of Online Application Form on www.dte.org.in/fe2011 for CAP & CAPAI.
3. **Confirmation** of Online Application Form & Document Verification **at ARC only** by the eligible candidate **in person** for participation in the Centralised Admission Process for admission through CAP & CAPAI.
4. Display of Merit List of candidates who have confirmed the online **Application Form for CAP & CAPAI** on website www.dte.org.in/fe2011.
5. Fill in and confirm the Online **Option Form(s) for CAPAI Round(s) I/II/III** (by candidates eligible to participate in these CAPAI rounds) on the website www.dte.org.in/fe2011.
6. Display of **Allotment(s) of respective CAPAI Round(s) I/II/III** on the website www.dte.org.in/fe2011.
7. **Reporting to respective Institutes** as per allotment of **CAPAI Round(s) I/II/III**
8. Conduction of **CAPAI Round-IV by counseling** at respective Institute level and Reporting to respective Institute.

Note:-

A notification giving details such as schedule, procedure of Centralized Admission will be displayed on the website and published in leading newspapers.

Major Rules of the Centralized Admission Process for Autonomous Institutes are summarized below:-

- **Candidates who have confirmed admission in any one of the Autonomous Institutions (institutes mentioned in rule 1.0) through CAPAI are not eligible to participate in any subsequent CAP rounds of CAPAI conducted by the Directorate of Technical Education, M.S., Mumbai for the Autonomous Institutes.**
- **Candidates who have confirmed admission in any one of the CAP rounds I/II/III/IV conducted by DTE for other Engineering/Technology Institutions in Maharashtra State will not be able to participate in any admission rounds conducted for the Autonomous Institutes (institutes mentioned in rule 1.0).**
- **If a candidate cancels his/her admission, which was confirmed in earlier CAP round(s) or in the Autonomous Institutes, will not be eligible to participate in the subsequent CAP round(s) conducted by DTE and in the Admission Round(s) of Autonomous Institutes, even after cancellation of such admission.**

Details of eligibility for participating in each round of CAPAI, method of reporting after each CAPAI round, availability of seats for each CAPAI round and other details are given in the **Annexure-I** of this Information Brochure.

The scheme of allotment through Multiple Rounds and Rules of Reporting presented below is designed to prevent loss of academics and to make the CAP Rounds meaningful and effective

rather than formal and ineffective in view of the previous experience of this Directorate as also the facts and figures available with this Directorate as to the seats remaining vacant at the end of each Round(s) and especially at the end of all the Round(s) of such Centralized Allotment Process. The rounds are so designed with the purpose that, maximum vacant seats are filled in, without creating further resultant vacancies on account of shifting of students to whom already allotment has been made in earlier rounds of CAPAI. This step is required to enable the colleges to start the academic activity immediately to complete the term in time.

Note:

In order to participate in the CAPAI, the aspiring & eligible candidate is required to submit and confirm the "Application Form for Centralized Admission to Engineering/Technology" at the ARC. The list of documents required to be submitted at the time of confirmation is given in the **Annexure–III**.

Summary of “Rules of Reporting” in CAP is as follows:

Seats remaining vacant after completion of CAPAI will be filled at the Institute level. The guidelines for vacancy round of admission and for admission against Institute level are given in the **Annexure-II** of this information brochure.

Various steps in the process of CAPAI are also given in the **Annexure-I**. The steps include issue of Information brochure, filling up & confirmation of Online CAP Application form, filling up & confirmation of Option form for each round of Centralized Allotment, Allotment process and Reporting Rules etc. Candidates are required to read carefully the details of CAPAI given in the **Annexure-I** and follow instructions given therein. **Annexure-III** gives various documents needed while attending the CAP.

6.1. CAPAI Rounds I/II/III by allotment and Round-IV by Centralized Counseling for Maharashtra State candidates (Type A,B,C,D,E)

Eligible candidates: - All the eligible Maharashtra State candidates (Type A-E) who have a basic eligibility MHT-CET-2011 score and have been assigned Maharashtra State Merit number and whose name appear in the merit list for respective CAPAI rounds prepared by the Competent Authority shall be considered for allotment in these Rounds.

Seats available: Refer Rule 1.4, and 1.5.

6.1.1. CAPAI Rounds I/II/III: Direct Allotment:

Allotment of seats coming under CAPAI is carried out as per the logic explained in the rule 6.1.3.

For the CAPAI Round-I, Stage-I, Stage – II and Stage-III of rule 6.1.3 shall be executed. Seats remaining vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting will be available for allotment in CAPAI Round-II.

For the CAPAI Round-II, Stage-I to Stage-VI of rule 6.1.3 shall be executed. Seats remaining vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting will be available for allotment in CAPAI Round-III.

For the CAPAI Round-III, Stage-I to Stage-VII of rule 6.1.3 shall be executed. Seats remaining vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting will be available for admission through counseling Round at Institute level i.e. CAPAI Round-IV.

The seat tags i.e. *Reserved category, PH, DEF, Ladies* etc. shall be maintained during allotment in CAPAI Round-I, II and III.

6.1.2 CAPAI Round IV- Admission by Centralized Counseling at Institute Level:

CAPAI Round-IV of admission will be conducted only for eligible Maharashtra State Candidates whose names have appeared in Maharashtra State Merit list (subject to eligibility of participation as set out in the Annexure-I). During this round of admission by Counseling, no seat tag will be applied i.e. seats available shall be treated as GENERAL seats and shall be allotted solely on the basis of inter-se merit of eligible MS candidates without any reference whatsoever to the category of the candidate(s) (open /reserved) or the category to which the vacant seat belongs (such as Backward Class, Physically Handicapped, Defence etc) and the admission will be carried out at the respective Institute.

The number of the seats available for this Round will be made available on website to the eligible candidates before start of this round.

General Notes:

- Allotment of seats will be carried out as per *inter se* merit of the eligible candidates.
- Seats will be allotted to candidates as per their *inter se* merit, as per the options filled and the number of seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAPAI Round-I, II, III.
- All candidates eligible for a particular stage of allotment will be considered for allotment for a seat in that stage, even if they have been allotted/not allotted a seat in the previous stage.
- During the allotment of any stage, the candidate may get upward shift in the allotment with reference to the options filled by the candidate according to availability of seats at that point of time.
- All reserved category candidates (including SBC in their original category) shall be considered for allotment (whether they are allotted any seat in earlier stage or not) in all stages.
- Due to upward shifts, the seats falling vacant shall be considered for allotment in further iterations of the same stage as per the provisions of that stage of allotment and as per *inter se* merit.
- Allotment against the first available option in the order of options filled is retained as final allotment.
- During Round I, Round-II and Round-III stage I & II will be repeated twice after stage III for upward shifts to all the candidates due to allotment to SBC candidates in stage – III.
- The allotment will be displayed on DTE website <http://www.dte.org.in/fe2011>. The allotment list displayed will show only the provisional allotment offered to the candidates.
- **No personal communication/Allotment letters in this regard will be issued to the concerned candidates.**
- The logic for allotment mentioned at rule no.6.1.3 will be implemented using computer software for the direct allotment.

- The candidates securing allotment will confirm the admission by reporting at the institute mentioned in allotment along with the original certificates needed for admission, by paying necessary fees on or before the last date specified for the same. **No personal communication in this regard will be issued.**
- The admission will be confirmed at the 'Respective Institute' only after scrutiny of documents and payment of fees as prescribed by the Government. (Please refer rule no.7.1 for details)

6.1.3 Logic for Allotment:

The seats available for the implementation of this logic will include the State level seats coming under the purview of Competent Authority for CAPAI.

Stage – I: For all the candidates

- All the candidates (open/reserved/male/female/TFWS) of all the categories shall be considered for allotment as per their *inter se* merit.
- Backward class category candidates shall be considered for allotment in open category seat by virtue of their merit or in their respective category of reservation if open category seats are not available at their merit.
- SBC category candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open category by virtue of their merit or in their original category of reservation, if open seats are not available as per their merit.
- Physically handicapped category candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them by virtue of their merit or in open category as per their inter-se merit if the seats reserved for physically handicapped are not available at their merit.
- Defence category candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them by virtue of their merit or in open category as per their inter-se merit if the seats reserved for defence category candidates are not available at their merit.
- For the female candidates, the availability of seat shall be checked in the following order:
 1. in the seats reserved for females in open category,
 2. in the general seats in open category,
 3. in the seats reserved for females in respective caste category as applicable,
 4. in the general seats in their respective caste category as applicable.

Stage – II: For respective Backward Class Candidates

- On completion of Stage – I, if any of the backward class categories mentioned above do not get the required number of female candidates for the percentages laid down, the seats so remaining vacant shall be considered for allotment to male candidates belonging to respective Backward Class category.

Stage –III: For Special Backward Class category candidates

- On completion of Stage-II, if any of the backward class categories mentioned above, does not get the required number of candidates for the percentages laid down, the seats so remaining vacant shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates (male and female taken together) of Special Backward Class (SBC) category, as per their inter se merit, limited to the extent of two percent seats of Maharashtra State seats for CAPAI, which are coming under the purview of Competent Authority .

Stage –IV: For respective groups of Backward Class category candidates

All the Backward class category candidates will be considered for allotment in this stage in the groups as mentioned below.-

Group 1: i) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Castes converted to Buddhism (SC)

ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside the specified areas (ST)

Group 2: i) Vimukta Jatis/De- Notified Tribes (VJ/DT) NT(A)

ii) Nomadic Tribes 1 (NT-B)

Group 3: i) Nomadic Tribes 2 (NT-C)

ii) Nomadic Tribes 3 (NT-D)

iii) Other Backward Class (OBC)

- On completion of Stage –III, the seats remaining vacant in the respective group of categories as mentioned above, shall be considered for allotment to the candidates of respective group as per the inter se merit of the candidates.

Stage-V: For all Backward Class category candidates

The seats reserved for Backward class category candidates remaining vacant after completion of Stage –IV, shall be considered for allotment to the candidates of all the reserved categories together, on the basis of their *inter se* merit.

Stage –VI: For all Physically Handicapped candidates

The seats of physically handicapped remaining vacant after completion of Stage-V, shall be considered for allotment to the candidates of the category of Physically handicapped (P-1, P-2 and P-3 taken together), on the basis of their combined inter se merit.

Stage –VII: For all candidates (without any type of reservation and Seat tag)

The seats remaining vacant after completion of Stage –VI, shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates (open/reserved/male/female/) on the basis of their *inter se* merit.

6.1.4 Reporting of Candidates of CAPAI Rounds:

- After the display of allotment of CAPAI Rounds, candidate should report to the respective Institutes where they have been allotted a seat as per the notified schedule of the admission process.
- Candidates shall report to the concerned institute with ALL original certificates needed to substantiate the claims made in the application regarding eligibility and reservation.
- **If the candidate fails to report to the allotted institute within specified schedule i.e. on or before the last date of reporting after each allotment round, then such a candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.**
- If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting necessary original documents within the reporting time for CAPAI Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- If a candidate is **unable to produce original certificates** at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured to some other institution, he or she shall produce a certificate from the head of the institution where he/she has already taken admission indicating that he/she has been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of the certificates duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. Such candidates shall be required to pay the fees immediately at the time of admission and such candidates shall be permitted to submit the required **original certificates within 04 working days** after the date of payment of fees.
- After scrutiny of original documents, the candidate will have to pay prescribed full fees immediately in the form as prescribed by the concerned institute and confirm the admission offered. The candidates are required to pay the tuition fees in the form of Demand draft in favour of the Registrar/Director as the case may be.
- If candidate fails to pay the prescribed full fees within the reporting time for CAPAI Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat immediately.
- If a candidate is offered admission, his or her original School / College Leaving Certificate (after qualifying examination) will be retained by the concerned Institute. This original School / College Leaving certificate will not be returned to any candidate once admitted to a course at the institute unless the candidate cancels his/her admission. All other certificates will be verified by the Institute at the time of admission & returned to the candidate.

IMPORTANT NOTE TO INSTITUTES WHILE CONFIRMING ADMISSION:

- Directors of respective institutes are required to carefully scrutinize all the required documents submitted by the candidates at the time of reporting. Any discrepancy in the claims as type, category, eligibility etc. made by the candidates and/or such claims which are not supported by

relevant documents should be immediately brought to the notice of the Directorate of Technical Education before confirming the admission of such candidates. The Directors of the Institute shall be responsible for issues/litigation arising out of such admissions.

6.1.5 Additional Round(s): Counseling Round at Institute Level: For all the Maharashtra State candidates on the basis of MHT-CET-2011 only

- If any vacancies remain after the end of CAPAI Round-IV, the respective Director of the Institute shall conduct additional round of admission for all the Maharashtra State candidates (open/reserved/male/female) of all the categories as per their *inter se* merit of MHT-CET-2011 score.
- The no. of vacancies and schedule of admission should be displayed on the website of the Institute, published in a local newspaper and on the notice board of the Institute.

7.0 Fees, concessions, cancellations and refund:

7.1 Fees prescribed:

The fees applicable for these autonomous institutes are as given in following table:

In case the Govt. revises the fees for the autonomous institutes for the year 2011-12, then the admitted candidates will be required to pay the difference in fees as per the Government order.

Note:

1. Candidates claiming for fee concession under Backward Class category shall produce the **Caste/Tribe Validity Certificate**. Candidates claiming for fee concession **under OBC, SBC, VJ/ DT (A), NT-B, NT-C and NT-D category** shall also produce **Non-Creamy layer certificate Valid up to 31st March 2012**.
2. For confirmation of seat allotted in CAPAI Rounds, Candidates have to submit a Demand Draft of Rs.37,500/- in favor of Director of respective institute, payable at the place of the institute.

Candidates claiming concession in backward class category have to submit a Demand Draft of amount Rs.12, 500/- and those taking admissions on tuition fee waiver seats have to submit a Demand draft of Rs. 22,500/-.

3. Additional fees such as the University Fees as specified by the University and Hostel Fees in case of candidates opting for hostel accommodation, Insurance etc. and any other fees as applicable to respective institute shall be charged at institute level from the candidates.

7.2 Caution Money:

Caution money deposits received from the students shall be refunded after successful completion of the course or after canceling the admission. Unless there is any recovery, no deduction shall be made from the caution money deposit. However, the amount of caution money deposit shall be credited to institute, if the candidate does not apply for refund, within 3 complete financial years after the student actually leaves the institution; or, within 3 complete financial years after the date of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier.

7.3 Reimbursement of Tuition fee:

Candidates claiming concession under the categories of EBC and sons and daughters for teaching and non-teaching staff of primary, secondary and higher secondary schools shall pay entire fee as applicable at the time of admission and subsequently candidates have to apply to the respective authorities for reimbursement of tuition fees. The quantum of reimbursement received by the institute from the concerned authorities shall be disbursed to the candidate.

7.4 Cancellation of admission and Refund of fees:

Refund of tuition fee, development and other fees after cancellation of admission secured through CAPAI rounds, institute level rounds and vacancy rounds of admissions, AICTE guidelines No. AICTE / Legal/ 04(01)/ 2007, April 2007 Candidate who has been admitted may cancel admission by submitting an application in duplicate, in the prescribed proforma - E may request for refund of fees. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made in due course. It is made clear that such application for cancellations will be considered if and only if the admission is confirmed by paying the prescribed tuition fee and other fees in full and by submitting the original documents. Refund shall be made after deduction of cancellation charges as shown below –

Note:

- 1) Entire amount of security / caution money deposit shall be refunded.
- 2) For calculation of amount on the prorata-basis, one month shall be treated as one unit e.g. if the candidate cancels the admission on third day after start of academic session and seat could be filled before the cut-off date, then cancellation charges will be the higher amount of (Total fees) /12 or Rs.1000/-.

Cancellation of admission and refund of fees will be carried out by respective institutes as per the rule mentioned above.

7.5 Issue of College Leaving Certificate:

1. If during the course of studies, candidate desires to discontinue studies for any reason whatsoever, he/ she shall be allowed to do so and it shall be presumed that he/ she has cancelled admission at that stage. The Director of respective Institute shall issue College Leaving Certificate and fees shall be refunded as per the rules.
2. If the admission is cancelled on or before 30 days from the last date of reporting of CAPAI round, the original school or college leaving certificate on the strength of which a candidate was admitted shall be returned.
3. If the admission is cancelled after 30 days from the last date of reporting after the last round, the leaving certificate from the institution where the candidate was finally admitted will be issued. A true copy of the original school or college leaving certificate retained by the institute may be issued, if requested by the candidate, duly attested by the Head of the Institute.

8.0 Actions to be taken in case of excess admissions and late uploading of admitted candidates & Refund Cases

8.1 Excess admissions

- Excess admissions over the sanctioned intake shall not be allowed under any circumstances.
- In case any excess admission is reported/noted by the DTE / AICTE, appropriate penal action will be initiated against the Institution.
- The Institution shall be liable to following punitive action from any one or more of the following by the DTE and/or AICTE.
 - surcharge amounting five times the total fees collected per student shall be levied against each excess admission
 - seats equal to double the number of excess admissions shall be reduced from intake in the subsequent academic year
 - Suspension of approval for supernumerary seats
 - No admission status in one/more courses
 - Withdrawal of approval for programme/course
 - Withdrawal of approval of the Institution
 - Institution shall be listed as defaulter and defaulter list shall be communicated to AICTE and will be published on DTE website for the information of general public

8.2 Late uploading of Admitted candidates on DTE web site.

- The Director of the **respective Institute** is required to carry out “**Online Update**” of the **confirmation/cancellation** of the candidate’s admission on DTE website through their Institute login, at the time when the candidate is being **admitted/cancelled** at the Institute.
- After admission in each CAPCAI Round, the status of admission of the candidates should be updated on the DTE web site.
- The system shall automatically generate the list of admitted candidate of respective institute.
- The institute is required to take a printout of the merit list of the admitted candidate and will submit it to the competent authority for approval.
- If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting the application form by submitting the necessary original documents and fails to pay the prescribed fees in full at the time of **CAPCAI** Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the seat immediately.
- If the institute fails to update the status of Cancellation of the candidate on the date of cancellation through “Online Update”, then strict action shall be taken against such institutes. It is mandatory to cancel the admission through online system only and issue the printout of the “Online Receipt of the Cancellation” to the candidate with due seal and signature of the authority of the institute.

- **Rounds of admission for Institute Level Seats and for the seats remaining vacant after CAPCAI should be carried out separately and it should be clearly displayed on the Notice board of the institute**
- The Director/Principal of the institute has to also update the list of all admitted candidates on the DTE website through their institute login clearly indicating the stage of their admission like CAPCAI, Against CAPCAI vacancy, Institute level, PIO, FN, FS, NRI etc. **within 5 days from the cut off date** of the admission.
- If the institute fails to update the reporting of the candidate through “**Online Update**”, the action shall be taken against the institute as per the Government Resolution dated 29.03.2008.
- Three copies of list are to be printed and to be submitted to the DTE, duly signed by the Head of the Institute within 7 days from the cut off date for information.
- The DTE shall accord the final approval to the list of admitted candidates. It is binding on the Universities to grant enrollment only to the students who are on approved list.

Important Note: All the institutes are required to complete their admission process on or before the cut-off date as specified in the schedule. Any admission carried out after cut-off date shall be termed as excess admission and shall not be approved.

8.3 Refund Cases after cancellation of admission

Institutions not following guidelines given by AICTE regarding refund of fees on cancellations or delaying refunds shall be liable to following punitive action from any one or more of the following by DTE and/or AICTE.

- Surcharge amounting two times the total fees collected per student shall be levied against each case regarding refund.
- Seats equal to double the number of such cases shall be reduced from intake in the subsequent academic year.
- Suspension of approval for supernumerary seats, if any.

8.4 Miscellaneous:

- **The medium of instruction for degree course in Engineering/ Technology in all the Institutes is English.**
- Admission of **Type B , Type C, Type-D and Type E candidate** admitted to any course at any Institute will be treated as **finally confirmed** only on receipt of the **Eligibility Certificate from the University** to which the Institute is affiliated.
- **Physical fitness:** Head of the Institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority and the action taken by the Director of respective institution shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education

- for information. It is to be noted that physically handicapped candidates are not provided with any additional facilities as far as the academic activities pertaining to the course is concerned.
- Head of the Institution may verify the antecedents of any candidate through the appropriate police authority. The report received from police authority and the action taken by the Director of respective institution shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for information.
 - Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Govt. / Institute takes any policy decision pertaining to F.Y. B. Tech. admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect at that point of time as per the directives from the Govt./ Institute from time to time.

9.0 Hostel accommodation:

Accommodation in Hostel cannot be guaranteed to all the admitted candidates. The availability of Rooms, Intake capacity of each course, Merit of candidate and statutory reservations shall be considered while allotting the hostel facility to the candidates. The detail information is available in the respective institute profile given in this brochure.

10.0 Change of Course after successfully completing the first year:

The eligible candidate seeking for a change in course after successfully completing the first year of studies will be allowed to do so in the **same institute subject to the availability of seats** and allotment will be carried out based on the marks of First Year. **However no transfer will be allowed to any other autonomous Institutes for any reasons whatsoever during the course.**

11.0 Conduct and Discipline

11.1 Conduct and discipline for all students & colleges (Regarding admissions):

- Failure of the candidate in making **full and correct Statements** in the application form and/or **suppression** of any information and/or submission of false documents shall **lead to disqualification** of the candidate for CAPCAI or even at later date during the study. Such a candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process. Therefore the candidate is required to make only such claims which could be substantiated by relevant original documents.
- Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority.

- Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Govt. takes any policy decision pertaining to First Year of Degree course in Engineering admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect at that point of time as per the directives from the Govt. from time to time.
- Students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.
- **Condition of minimum attendance: I am fully aware that, I will not be allowed to appear for the examination if I do not attend minimum 75 per cent classes of theory, practical, drawing etc. I am also aware that I will not be allowed to appear for the examination, if I fail to submit satisfactorily all the assignments, jobs, journals, drawings, reports as may be specified by the University within stipulated time limit.**

Action against ragging: Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 and Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging (Appendix 12 published in AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2011-12) and their amendments which may be published from time to time. The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 is in effect from 15th May, 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.

- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited,
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty, which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that there is

no substance, prima facie, in the complaint received, he / she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final.

- e) If the Head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above.

Any Acts or its amendments which may be published from time to time by AICTE, Government or Judgments by Hon. Supreme Court of India, Hon. High Court of Bombay etc will be applicable to Candidates and Institutions covered under these rules of admission.

If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied or any certificate(s) submitted by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal/Director. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be sent within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final. Such candidates are also liable for penal action as per the provisions in the law.

12.0 Legal Jurisdiction:

All disputes pertaining to the conduct of examination and admission shall fall within the jurisdiction of Mumbai High Court, bench at Mumbai only. The Competent Authority shall be the legal person in whose name the Government of Maharashtra may sue or may be sued.

13.0 Undertaking:

All candidates who have applied for admission shall be deemed to have submitted the following undertaking:

I have read all the Rules of Admission and after understanding these rules thoroughly, I have filled in the application form for admission for the current year. The information given by me in my application is true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I understand that if any of the statements made by me in the application form or any information supplied by me in connection with my admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, my admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and I may be expelled from the college by the Director/ Principal.

- a). I have not been debarred from appearing at any examination held by any Government constituted or statutory examination authority in India.

- b). I fully understand that the allotment of a course will be made to me depending on my inter se merit, order of option given by me and the number of seats available at that point of time in a stage.
- c). I understand that no document after the last date of submission will be entertained for the purpose of claims or concessions etc. in connection with my admission unless otherwise mentioned in the rules.
- d). I am fully aware that the Competent Authority or its representative will not make any correspondence with me regarding admission. I am also aware that it is entirely my responsibility to see the notifications in the newspaper(s) and notices on the notice boards of these autonomous institutes and website of competent authority.
- e). I am aware that any rule imposed by the Institute such as 'imposing limits on the number of attempts permissible to pass any examination' shall be binding on me.
- f). I hereby agree to conform to any Rules, Acts and Laws enforced by Government and I hereby undertake that, I will do nothing either inside or outside the college which may result in disciplinary action against me under these rules, acts and laws referred to.
- g). I fully understand that the Director of the college where I would be admitted, has a right to expel me from the college for any infringement of the rules of conduct and discipline prescribed by the college or University or Government and the undertaking given above.
- h). Condition of minimum attendance: I am fully aware that, I will not be allowed to appear for the examination if I do not attend **minimum 75 per cent** classes of theory, practical, drawing etc. I am also aware that I will not be allowed to appear for the examination, if I fail to submit satisfactorily all the assignments, jobs, journals, drawings, reports as required within stipulated time limit.

14.0 Rights regarding the admission process:

All Rights regarding the admission process of the CAPCAI are reserved with the competent authority.

Important Note: The admission process will be freezed even if vacancy gets created after cut-off date. No institute can admit students after cut-off date even if vacancy exists.

The procedure for CAPAI consists of following **major** stages:

1. **Issue of Information Brochure at ARCs**
2. **Filling up of Online Application Form** on www.dte.org.in/fe2011 for CAP & CAPAI.
3. **Confirmation of Online Application Form & Document Verification at ARC** only by the eligible candidate in person for participation in the Centralised Admission Process for admission through CAP & CAPAI.
4. **Display of provisional Merit List** on website www.dte.org.in/fe2011, indicating State level merit, Category Merit, PH Merit, Defence Merit etc.
5. **Issue of Information Brochure at ARCs**
6. **Filling up** of Online Application form for CAP & CAPAI.
7. **Confirmation & Receipt of Acknowledgement** of Online Application form at ARC
8. Display of Provisional Merit list of CA & CAPP AI
9. **Filling up** of Online Option Form on website www.dte.org.in/fe2011, for each of the CAPAI rounds I/II/III by eligible candidates.
10. **Confirmation & Receipt of Acknowledgement** of Online Option Form for each of the CAPAI rounds I/II/III by the eligible candidate ***in person at ARC only***
11. **Display of Provisional Allotment** indicating allotment after each of the CAPAI rounds I/II/III on the website www.dte.org.in/fe2011 and at the **ARC**
12. **Reporting to the institute** as per allotment of the CAPAI rounds I/II/III and confirmation of admission by the candidate
13. **Conduction of CAPAI Round-IV** i.e. admission round by counseling at Institute level.

NOTE:-

Eligible Maharashtra candidates who have appeared in MHT-CET 2011 & fulfill minimum eligibility criteria for admission are required to submit single Application form for CAP & CAPAI. They are required to carry their original score card of MHT-CET 2011 for issue of the Information brochure from the ARC.
- All the information printed in the brochure will also be available on the website www.dte.org.in/fe2011 for browsing, downloading and printing

Stage II- Submission of Application form for Admisstion through CAP & CAPAI

- The aspiring candidate should read the brochure carefully.
- Aspiring candidates are required to submit their application forms online through the web site www.dte.org.in/fe2011 within the scheduled time.
- Candidates will be able to fill in the Online Application form through any computer connected to Internet either from home/ cyber café or at any of the ARCs.
- Candidates are required to enter his/her details as per instructions given for online Application Form.

- The online software application hosted on the web site will validate the information filled in by the candidate and assign his/her unique Application ID. Using this Application ID, candidate will be able to login to the online admission system to update his/her information, check status of processing of his/her application form, check position in the merit list, fill option form(s), print Online Option Form, check the seat allotted in CAPAI and CAP rounds I/II/III, status of reporting.
- The candidate should take the printout of his/her application form. It will display the list of the documents required by the candidate to substantiate the claims made on the application form. The candidates must note the Application ID and Password on backside of Xth marklist, which will be required at the time of confirmation at the ARC and the institutes and also for any future reference to the information filled in by the candidate on the web site.
- The candidate can update the data himself/herself before confirmation of the application form at any ARC through his/her login. Once the application is confirmed at ARC, the information can not be changed/ edited.

Stage III – Confirmation & Receipt of Acknowledgement of Application form for CAP & CAPAI

IMPORTANT:

This is a MANDATORY step for all Maharashtra candidates. Online submitted Applications will be considered valid for further processing only after the confirmation of the submission of Online Application Form. If the candidate does not confirm the online filled application form, then such online filled application will be rejected and name of such candidate will not appear in the merit list(s) prepared for the purpose of CAPAI. Such candidates whose names do not appear in the merit list(s) will not be able to participate in entire Centralized admission process.

- The ARC officer shall confirm candidate's application through web and issue him/her the Receipt-cum-Acknowledge of Online submitted application form, which will have the particulars of the candidate's profile, important instructions etc.

Note: DO NOT send printout of online application form **by post/courier** to the ARC for confirmation. Such applications will be summarily rejected and no communication will be done.

Stage- IV: Display of provisional Merit list

- Provisional Merit List of eligible Maharashtra candidates, TFWS Candidates, will be displayed on www.dte.org.in/fe2011 and at the ARCs as per the schedule.
- For discrepancy in the provisional merit list, if any, get the corrections by lodging the grievance at ARCs, where the candidate has confirmed the application within the period specified in the schedule. No additional document to substantiate the claim made in application shall be accepted.
- Final merit lists will be displayed on the www.dte.org.in/fe2011 and at ARCs as per the Schedule.

NOTE: - The merit list gives relative position of the candidate and it does not guarantee admission to any course.

General Instructions for filling online option form for CAPAI Round(s)

- The candidate has to login to the website www.dte.org.in/fe2011 through his/her application ID and Password.
- The candidate eligible for CAPAI Round I/II/III should fill the Online Option Form.
- Every course has been allotted a 9-digit choice code, which is given in the "Annexure-V" of the Information Brochure.

- ❖ Confirmed their admissions in any one of the other Engineering/Technology Colleges in the Maharashtra State or who have got allotment at option 1 through 9 in CAP Round I.
- The Candidate should fill fresh online Option form as per the schedule through their login on the website, failing which the candidate shall not be considered eligible for the allotment.
- The Candidate should select the **choice codes with an order of preference i.e. first, second etc. Candidate is permitted to fill minimum 1 and maximum 30 options for CAPAI round-II.**
- Candidate is required to pay processing fees of CAPAI Round-II, **Rs.100/- in cash** at the ARC and obtain a receipt for the same.
- The ARC officer shall confirm the Option form and give the confirmation report to the candidate indicating the preference wise options given by the candidate.

Such candidates will not be eligible to participate in subsequent round(s) of Centralized Admission. Such candidates will be disqualified for further Rounds of CAP & CAPAI.
3. All such seats, on which the candidates have confirmed the admission on or before the last date of reporting of CAPAI Round-II, shall not be available for allotment in subsequent round(s) of Centralized Admission.

Stage-IX: Filling up of online option form & Confirmation of Online filled Option Form for CAPAI Round III

Eligible Candidates for CAPAI Round-III:

The candidates whose names have appeared in the Maharashtra Merit List of CAPAI round-II published by the Directorate of Technical Education **excluding** the candidates who have:

- ❖ Secured an allotment in CAPAI Round-II, which was out of First Fifteen options
- ❖ Secured an allotment in CAPAI Round-II which was between options 16-30 and confirmed admission by reporting to the respective institute
- ❖ Confirmed their admissions in any one of the other Engineering/Technology Colleges in the Maharashtra State or who have got allotment at option 1 through 15 in CAP Round II.

- The Candidate should fill fresh online Option form as per the schedule through their login on the website, failing which the candidate shall not be considered eligible for the allotment.
- The Candidate should select the **choice codes with an order of preference i.e. first, second etc. Candidate is permitted to fill minimum 1 and maximum 45 options for CAPAI round-III.**
- The Candidate should go to the ARC **in person** for option form confirmation along with all the **required documents for verification.**
- Candidate is required to pay processing fees of CAPAI Round-III, **Rs.100/- in cash** at the ARC and obtain a receipt for the same.
- The ARC officer shall confirm the Option form and give the confirmation report to the candidate indicating the preference wise options given by the candidate.

Stage-X: Display of Allotment of CAPAI Round III, Reporting to the institute and confirmation of the admission

- The allotment through CAPAI Round III shall be displayed on www.dte.org.in/fe2011, at ARCs and also at the allotted institutes.
- No separate allotment letter will be issued to candidates.
- The candidate will report at the institute where the seat is allotted along with the necessary documents as per the notified schedule and fees as prescribed by the respective institute on the DTE web site www.dte.org.in/fe2011.
- Candidates are required to submit the Receipt-cum-Acknowledgement of Application for CAP to the Admission authority of the institute for the confirmation of the admission.
- Candidates will confirm the admission at the institute where the seat is allotted as per the schedule notified.
- The respective institute will update the confirmation of the candidate's admission on DTE website through their institute login as per the schedule notified.
- The respective **Institute** will carry out "**Online Update**" of the confirmation of the candidate's admission on DTE website through their Institute login immediately when **the candidate is being admitted at the Institute**. The system shall automatically generate an acknowledgement. The institute shall take a printout of the receipt and then the status of candidate will change to 'Reported Candidate'. The Institute will be able to view the daily summary of the reported candidates along with fee and document details.
- If the candidate fails to report to and confirm the admission at the Institute, on or before the last date of reporting at the Institute then the candidate shall forfeit claim on the allotted seat.
- It is not permitted for a candidate to cancel his/her admission of CAPAI round III and apply/appear for the subsequent round of centralized admission.

Rules of Reporting of CAPAI Round III :

- All candidates who have secured an allotment to any one submitted **options** will not be eligible for participating in subsequent round(s) irrespective of whether the candidate confirms the admission or not. Hence such candidates are advised **to confirm the admission** at the respective Institute as per the allotment in the CAPAI Round-III. Such candidates will be disqualified for further Rounds of CAP & CAPAI.
- All such seats, on which the candidates have confirmed the admission on or before the last date of reporting of CAP Round-III, shall not be available for admission in subsequent round of Centralized Admission.

- The Merit list of Maharashtra State candidate for CAPAI Round IV will be prepared from Merit list of Maharashtra State candidate of CAPAI Round III by excluding the names of the candidates who have got allotment in CAPAI Round III.

Stage-XI: CAPAI Round IV- Counseling round of Admission (At respective Institutes)

Eligible Candidates for CAPAI Round-IV:

The candidates whose names have appeared in the Maharashtra Merit List of CAPAI round-III published by the Directorate of Technical Education

excluding the candidates who have:

- ❖ Secured an allotment in CAP Round-III
 - ❖ Secured an allotment in CAPAI Round-III
1. All Maharashtra seats under purview of Competent Authority accept the seats for which the candidates have reported in Round-I, Round II and Round-III.
 2. All vacant seats shall be available without any seat tag such as Backward, PH, Def etc. and will be considered as State Level General seats.

Rules of Reporting for CAPAI Round-IV:

- Eligible candidates must report **in-person** at the respective institute in order to secure admission in this round of admission strictly as per the notified schedule. Candidate who reports late will not be allowed to participate in this round.
- Candidate is required to pay processing fees of CAPAI Round-IV, **Rs.100/- in cash** at the respective institute and obtain a receipt for the same.
- The candidate will report as per schedule at the **respective institute** along with the necessary original documents and fees prescribed.
- Eligible Candidates who report to the respective institute will be offered admission to available seat as per the inter se merit of candidates.
- **Candidates who secure admission in this round must confirm the admission on the spot by paying total fees as prescribed and submitting necessary documents in original.**
- The **respective institute** will update the confirmation of the candidate's admission on DTE website through the login immediately.
- If the candidate fails to submit the necessary documents in original and fails to pay the fees on spot then the candidate shall lose the claim on the allotted seat

ANNEXURE-II

Guidelines for the Admission Process to be carried out by Institute against the CAPAI vacancy & Institute Level Seats

1.0 Admissions to CAPAI allottees for the institute

Admission authority in the institute shall follow the procedure mentioned under rule 6.4 for Reporting of candidates.

2.0 Eligibility criteria of candidates for admission process to be carried out at institute level for the vacant seats after CAPAI Rounds:

Seats available:

Vacancy within sanctioned intake due to the Non Reporting, Non Allotment and Cancellations (if any).

- The vacancies in backward class category seats within sanctioned intake shall be filled after removing the seat tag i.e. by treating these seats as GENERAL seats. The seats thus shall be filled after preparing a common merit list of all the eligible candidates as per rule no. 2.1 who have applied for the Vacancy round at the respective institute.

Guidelines for the admission:

- All admissions shall be done in fully fair and Transparent Manner & shall be Merit based.
- The Director of the respective Autonomous Institutes shall invite applications for the seats available by giving publicity at least in two newspapers. Vacancies are also to be displayed on the notice board of the Institute. Detailed schedule of the admission process is also to be displayed.
 - Aspiring candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria shall apply directly to the Director of the respective institutes for admissions. These admissions will be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the merit of the candidates who have applied to the institute.

Guidelines for the admission process for Institute level seats:

- All admissions shall be done in fully fair and transparent Manner & shall be Merit based.
- The Director of the respective Autonomous Institutes shall invite applications for the seats available by giving publicity at least in two newspapers. Institutes are required to mention the name of newspaper in which available seats will be notified in their prospectus/brochure. Detailed schedule of the admission process is also to be displayed.

- Aspiring candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria shall apply directly to the Director of the respective institute for admissions. These admissions will be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the merit of the candidates who have applied to the institute.
- Information brochure/prospectus of the Institute which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission for seats to be filled at the Institute Level. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institute's website.

General Notes:

1. The allotment list of CAPAI rounds will be available to the institute through their Institute Login. The Institute should update the information of the reported candidates, allotted under CAP on the same day on which the candidate is reporting to the institute.
2. The institute authority has to update the branch wise list of admitted candidates on DTE website through their institute login clearly indicating the stage of their admission like CAPAI, against vacancy of CAPAI, Institute Level seats, etc.
3. Three copies of such lists are to be printed and to be submitted to the concerned Regional Office of Technical Education, duly signed by the Head of the Institute.
4. It is binding on all the Universities to grant enrollment only for the students on approved list.

Important: All the Autonomous Institutes are required to complete their admission process on or before the cut off date as specified in the schedule.

If the Candidates are not able to submit the caste/Tribe Validity Certificate then they are required to submit the Undertaking (Proforma H) at **the time of submission** of CAP application form for the Admission.
- @ Non-Creamy Layer Certificate:-**
A candidate belonging to 'Creamy Layer' amongst the categories VJ/DT-NT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), SBC and OBC must note that the provision of reservation is NOT applicable to him/her. A candidate claiming benefit of reservation under the categories VJ/DT-NT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), SBC and OBC above will be required to produce "**Non-Creamy Layer Certificate**" in the name of the candidate as specified in the **Government Resolution No. CBC-10/2008/C.R.697/BCW-5**, dated 27th February 2009 or its updated version from time to time. **This certificate should be valid upto 31st March 2012.** However, such a Non-Creamy Layer Certificate shall be produced in any case on or before the last date of filling up of Application Form for Admission to Engineering/Technology, failing which the category claim, will not be granted.

- **Certificate of the Indian Nationality:-**

The certificate of Indian Nationality, which is usually issued by the Tahshildar/Executive Magistrate/Dy. Collector of the concerned Taluka/District wherein the candidate ordinarily resides. In lieu of the **“Certificate of Indian Nationality”** any one of the following certificate will also be acceptable-

- The School leaving Certificate indicating the Nationality of the candidate as ‘Indian’.
- Indian Passport in the name of the candidate, issued by appropriate authorities.
- Birth Certificate of the Candidate indicating the place of birth in India.

#If the Candidate fails to produce any one of the above mentioned certificate/documents indicating nationality then such candidates Nationality shall be considered based on the undertaking given in Proforma-I on Rs. 100 Non-Judicial Stamp Paper at **the time of submission** of CAP application form for the Admission.

(Proforma H and I are provided in Institute Information brochure).

- **** Domicile certificate:**

Domicile certificate issued by the Maharashtra State’s appropriate authorities will be considered valid. The domicile certificate of Mother of the candidate shall be supported with marriage certificate and legal proof of change in name if any. Such candidates will be required to submit birth certificate clearly mentioning the name of the mother.

- Candidates are required to keep the documents ready at the time of filling up of “Application Form for Admission”.

Cut off date for the eligibility and/or submission of claim(s):

The eligibility and/or submission of claim(s) of the candidate shall be determined and/or decided for all purposes including for applicability of all these Rules and Regulations by considering the **last date of submission of “Application form for Admission to Engineering/Technology” as the cut off date.**

It is made abundantly clear that if a candidate is found ineligible and/or fails to produce documents in support of claim(s) on the last date of submission of Application Form for Admission to Engineering/Technology, in terms of these Rules and Regulations, and if such an ineligible candidate acquires the requisite eligibility and/or produces documents after the aforesaid cut off date, such subsequent acquisition of eligibility will not make an ineligible candidate eligible for any purpose whatsoever, muchless for the purpose of admission.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Admission under constitutional reservation seat will be governed by the Maharashtra Schedule Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Denotified Tribes (Vimukta Jatis), Nomadic Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Special Backward Category (Regulation of Issuance and Verification of) Caste Certificate Act, 2000 (Mah. Act No.XXIII of 2001) as below:

Para 10: (Benefits secured on the basis of false Caste Certificate to be withdrawn)

(1) Whoever not being a person belonging to any of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Denotified Tribes, (Vimukta Jatis), Nomadic Tribes, Other Backward Classes or Special Backward Category secures admission in any educational institution against a seat reserved for such Castes, Tribes or Classes, or secures any appointment in the Government, local authority or in any other company of Corporation, owned or controlled by the Government or in any Government aided institution or Co-Operative Society against a post reserved for such Castes, Tribes or Classes by producing a false Caste Certificate shall, on cancellation of the Caste Certificate by the Scrutiny Committee, be liable to be debarred from the concerned educational institution, or as the case may be, discharged from the said employment forthwith and any other benefits enjoyed or derived by virtue of such admission or appointment by such person as aforesaid shall be withdrawn forthwith.

(2) Any amount paid to such person by the Government or any other agency by way of scholarship, grant, allowance or other financial benefit shall be recovered from such person as an arrears of land revenue.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act for the time being in force, any Degree, Diploma or any other educational qualification acquired by such person after securing admission in any educational institution on the basis of a Caste Certificate which is subsequently proved to be false shall also stand cancelled, on cancellation of such Caste Certificate, by the Scrutiny Committee.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in any law for the time being in force, a person shall be disqualified for being a member of any statutory body if he has contested the election for local authority, Co-operative Society or any statutory body on the seat reserved for any of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, De-notified Tribes, (Vimukt jatis), Nomadic Tribes, Other Backward Classes or Special Backward Category by procuring a false Caste Certificate as belonging to such Caste, Tribe or Class on such false Caste Certificate being cancelled by the Scrutiny Committee; and any benefits obtained by such person shall be recoverable as arrears of land revenue and the election of such person shall be deemed to have been terminated retrospectively.

Para 11: (Offences & Penalties)

(1) Whoever,-

(a) Obtains a false Caste Certificate by furnishing false information or filing false statements or documents or any other fraudulent means ; or

(b) not being a person belonging to any of the Scheduled Tribes, De-notified Tribes, (Vimukt jatis), Nomadic Tribes, Other Backward Classes or Special Backward Category secures any benefits or appointment exclusively reserved for such Castes, Tribes or Classes in the Government, local authority or any other company or corporation owned or controlled by the Government or in any Government aided institution, or secures admission in any educational institution against a seat exclusively reserved for such Castes, Tribes or Classes or is elected to any of the elective offices of local authority or Co-operative Society against the office, reserved for such Castes, Tribes of Classes by producing a false Caste Certificate; shall, on conviction, be punished , with rigorous imprisonment for a term which shall not be less than six months but which may extent up to two years or with fine which shall not be less than two thousand rupees, but which may extend up to twenty thousand rupees or both.

(2) No court shall take cognizance of an offence punishable under this section except upon a complaint, in writing, made by the scrutiny Committee or by any other officer duly authorized by the Scrutiny Committee for this purpose.

Para 12: *(Offences under Act to be cognizable & nonbailable)*

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Code of Criminal Procedure; 1973 --

(a) offence punishable under section 11 shall be cognizable and non-bailable;

(b) every offence punishable under this Act, shall be tried by any Magistrate of First Class in a summary way and provisions of sections 262 except sub-section(2) to 265 both inclusive of this Code shall as far as possible may be applied to such trial.

Para 13: *(Penalty for issuing false Caste Certificate)*

(1) Any person or authority performing the functions of Competent Authority under this act, who intentionally issues of false Caste Certificate shall earn conviction, be punished with rigorous imprisonment for a term which shall not be less than six months but which may extend up to two years or with fine which shall not be less than two thousand rupees, but which may extend up to twenty thousand rupees or both.

(2) No court shall take cognizance of an offence punishable under this section except with the previous sanction of the Government.

Para 14: *(Penalty for abatement)*

Whoever abets any offence punishable under this Act shall be punished with the punishment provided for in this Act for such offence.

About the Institute:

The College of Engineering, Pune, established in the year 1854, is one of the oldest and premier engineering institutes in the Indian subcontinent. Initially it was started as the 'Poona Engineering Class and Mechanical School' to train subordinate officers for carrying out public works like buildings, dams, canals railways and bridges. Later on, the school became "Poona Civil Engineering College", and subsequently in the year 1911, the nomenclature was changed to the College of Engineering, Poona'. The institution was initially affiliated to the University of Bombay (now Mumbai) for a degree of Licentiate in Civil Engineering known as LCE. Later on, the certificate course and the first batch of the B. E. (Civil) degree came out in the year 1912. The degree in Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Electronics and Telecommunication, Metallurgy, Production, Instrumentation and Control, Computer Engineering and IT were introduced subsequently. The Post-graduate degree courses are being conducted in the various branches regularly since 1959.

The college has been recognized by AICTE, UGC and University of Pune and given full academic autonomy from 2003. All academic programmes, the academic calendar, examinations, results are managed by the Senate of the college. The Sandwich pattern courses, the only one of its kind in India, were introduced in Mechanical, Electrical and Metallurgy (1974) and Production (1995) and are well accepted by industries and the students.

The college has been a lead network institute under the Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme (TEQIP) of the Govt. of India. It has received a grant of Rs. 25 crores under TEQIP project, which has been effectively utilized for upgrading and modernizing a number of laboratories and classrooms. This has invigorated the college atmosphere. Funds from various Central Government agencies like AICTE, DST, CSIR, ISRO, UGC etc. are received for various R&D projects. The College has been a part of national institutes (IITs and IISc) in the virtual remote laboratory programme of MHRD. Students of COEP are developing a nano satellite to be launched by ISRO. The college being in the industrial hub of the country also receives a large number of consultancy and testing projects. The college at present has 92 Mbps connectivity. Every department in the institute and the hostels have computer laboratories with internet connectivity. The institute also has Wi-Fi connectivity at important locations in the campus.

Today the college enjoys administrative, academic, managerial and financial autonomy and is administered and guided by Board of Governors comprising of eminent educationists, engineers, scientists and industrialists.

To help efficient learning of engineering principles, institute has maintained state of the art laboratories equipped with modern facilities. Apart from conventional equipment, the Institute has in recent years acquired modern and state-of-the-art experimental facilities. Different laboratories are used for teaching, research and consultancy projects. The laboratory staffs are highly skilled and experienced and keep themselves abreast with latest technologies and equipment.

The Institute has well equipped library with an integrated automation system installed recently. It is one important central resource of the Institute for the students as well as faculty of the Institute. The library has a varied collection comprising of 65,000 plus books, 25,000 titles including technical reports, periodicals and other technical and non-technical publications, 54 National and 91 International journals and Periodicals. There is on line access to about 600 foreign journals covering all disciplines of the Institute through INDEST Consortium.

COEP has completed a large number of sponsored and consultancy projects for various Government and private agencies. The Government agencies include AICTE (with schemes such as MODROBS, RPS and TAPTECH) DST, CSIR, ISRO, UGC etc. The private companies include Intel Corporation Limited, NEETI Solutions, Pune etc. Over the years the institute has also developed excellent collaborative relationship leading to work on several advanced projects of national importance with a large number of agencies.

COEP provides hostel accommodation for 400 girls and 1050 boys. The hostel has ten buildings. Two blocks are kept for girl students and remaining eight blocks for boys. There is in-house boarding facility for the students staying in hostel. Computational and networking facilities are provided in every room along with a central computing lab with 75 terminals. A new 11 storey girl's hostel will be ready shortly.

2020-SGGS Institute Of Engineering and Technology, Vishnupuri-Nanded

About the Institute:

Established in 1981 at Nanded, Shri Guru Gobind Singhji Institute of Engineering and Technology (SGGS IE&T) is an AICTE approved Institute aided by Govt. of Maharashtra. The campus of 46 acres on which the institute is spread has been donated by Sant Baba Harnam Singh Langer Sahib Gurudwara trust and is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. In 2004, Govt. of Maharashtra granted autonomy to this institute to enable us to join the World Bank assisted program on Technical Education Quality Improvement program (TEQIP) of Govt. of India. The institute was selected as Network Institute and received a grant of Rs. 10.00 cores for enhancing the Laboratory facilities, Training the Faculty, Providing services to community and conduct programmes for tribal development.

The name was changed from 'SGGS College of Engineering' to 'SGGS Institute of Engineering & Technology' from the date of grant of autonomy by Govt. of Maharashtra and academic autonomy by UGC (in February 2005), New Delhi. With this change in the status, the constitution of Board of Governors was also changed and Mr. B. N. Kalyani, an eminent industrialist, heading the Kalyani Group of Companies has been nominated as Chairman of Board of Governors for the Institute. The government has also appointed renowned personalities from business and industry, academics and its senior administrative cadre on the Governing body. The institute will continue to receive block grants from the Govt. of Maharashtra from time to time.

The institute has a three pronged agenda- Teaching, Research, and Transfer of knowledge to the industry & society. Qualified and experienced teachers impart high quality education to students while encouraging them to pursue their innovative ideas by providing an environment conducive for continuous learning and development.

Research constitutes an integral part of the institute's activities which boasts of over 50 Ph.D.s amongst its faculty. It also sponsors the faculty for research in institutes of repute, in India and abroad. They are active members of associations like ACM, ISTE, IE, IETE and IEEE. This has paved the institute's way towards self- reliance through funds generated from industrial consultancy. The institute has also signed Mous with organizations of national and international repute for faculty exchange, collaborative research, joint publications, etc.



Institute has five buses at the service of students for their transportation from city to campus.

Internet facility is provided on all computers and students are promoted to make use of internet for enhancing their technical skills. Faculty members also are equipped with computer and internet.

The Central Computing Facility which is over and above the departmental facilities has been made available to the students from 2009. It has 250 advanced computing machines and at a time 250 students can work on the same.

Special counselling classes are conducted for improving soft skills of the students from the first year itself.

In majority of departments, a departmental library is maintained for the instant access to the students. This is in addition to the central library facility. Books, journals, project reports, conference proceedings are made available. These are donated by the faculty of the respective department.

About the Institute:

Walchand College of Engineering (WCE), Sangli is one of the oldest Engineering colleges in the state of Maharashtra. It was established in 1947, as New Engineering College with Civil Engineering degree programme and renamed in 1956 as Walchand College of Engineering. WCE is a preferred choice of students in the state because of its academic reputation and placement record. About 2500 students are currently realizing their dreams of quality engineering education leading to Degree, Post Graduate and Diploma qualifications. The campus is spread over 90-acres of land with beautiful surroundings. The college has hostel accommodation for about 600 students (400 Boys and 200 Girls). The college has a record of 100% placement of eligible students for the past three years.

Walchand College of Engineering is a private college receiving partial grant-in-aid from Government. The degree programmes of the college are affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and approved by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE). Walchand College of Engineering has been granted Autonomous status and is functioning as an Autonomous College from academic year 2007-08. It now offers B. Tech. and M. Tech. degrees under autonomous curriculum based on semester system and grading as followed in IITs. Post autonomy, the institute has carried out various reforms to improve the quality of education in the institute.

Walchand College of Engineering, Sangli was selected in 2004 for the Government of India scheme funded by the World Bank under Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme (TEQIP). The Institute has been granted a total funding of Rs. 8.54 crores under this scheme. The college has performed consistently high in implementation of TEQIP. It has set up a new Central Computing Facility, a Mechatronics lab, augmented library resources, renovated classrooms and other laboratories under these funds. A new state-of-the-art new library named as Ajit Gulabchand Central Library has been added in 2008 courtesy a generous donation from Seth Walchand Hirachand Memorial Trust.






Walchand College of Engineering aims to be a world class institution. In 2009, WCE has commissioned world's leading design and planning firm HOK Design and Planning Services (India) Pvt. Ltd. HOK has master planned many University campuses in the US. The WCE Campus Master Plan is now in final stage with inputs from the Chairman and members of the Administrative Council, Faculty, staff, students and alumni. It is proposed to develop the entire campus in three phases spread over next 10 to 15 years. WCE is in talks with experts to significantly revamp its academic programmes, laboratories and administrative systems. Under the leadership of Chairman Mr. AJit Gulabchand, WCE aims to become a self sustaining World class institute.

Ajit Gulabchand Central Library measuring 4244 sqm and costing Rs. 5.5 Crores is one of the largest library/facilities amongst engineering colleges in the country. Donated by Seth Walchand Hirachand Memorial Trust, the library building has modern facilities like Wi-Fi, Digital Library, Seminar Hall and Study Hall for students with a capacity of 250. The library has 44,495 volumes & 36,014 titles. The library subscribes to 55 national and 10 international journals in print version and to 209 online journals. Additionally, INDEST membership for 600 online journals supported by AICTE is available with our Library. The college has signed a MOU with IIT Bombay for availing the facility of their library. The library is also a member INSDOC. Library has created "Library database" of all reading materials including books, bound volumes of periodicals, dissertation and non-print materials such as CDs etc. This data is available on Web at DELNET site.

The library has also subscribed to DELNET which supports a huge database of research journals on the INTERNET. About 700 e-learning resources have been procured under TEQIP which are accessible on

INTRANET. The books, magazines, CDs retrieval facility is available through Intranet. In the year 2009-10, the Chairman Mr. Ajit Gulabchand donated Rs. 25 Lakh for purchasing international standard reference and text books. The Book Bank Scheme is in existence since 1970-71 under which sets of textbooks are given to meritorious students.

The college has set up a new Central Computing Facility (CCF) with an investment of over Rs. 3 crores with an addition of industry grade RACK servers, 150 high end desktops with TFT monitors, MIS, Educational CDs, Video lectures by eminent teachers from reputed institutes such as IITs (NPTEL), MATLAB, CATIA, AutoCAD etc. have been made in the past three years. in the CCF. Presently 10 MBPS leased line and 512 kbps broadband are provided for Internet connectivity and a campus wide network is available. Wireless internet connectivity has also been provided within the campus. Bandwidth Management is done through Firewall and Viruswall of E-lite core/Cyberoam.
